In the name of God of Righteousness and Justice

Appeal for the Enforcement of the Constitution and Rule of Law

April 3, 2022

More than seven months have elapsed since the fall of the government of the Islamic Republic (violating the foundations of the Republic) and the military seizure of power by the Taliban movement. The suspension of the constitution and other laws has created a major legal and legitimacy crisis. The coronavirus pandemic's misery, unemployment and poverty have put Afghanistan on the brink of an acute humanitarian catastrophe.

The Afghan Lawyers Association in Europe, in pursuit of its previous actions based on the deplorable realities, adherence to safeguarding the highest interests of Afghanistan, along with other institutions, submits this call to our compatriots, with the intention to discuss the key salvage issues in a national public debate before falling into the quagmire of proxy wars.

Historical experience shows the fact that dealing with all these problems will be possible only in the presence of a powerful, responsible, and accountable national government. It is obvious that such a state is formed in the existence of the constitution, the rule of law and justice. It is the rule of law that opens the way to legitimacy. The right of national sovereignty, based on the religious values and internationally accepted norms, is the exclusive competence of the people and the source of legitimacy, can be exercised only in the light of law.

The rule of law is an umbrella for all segments of the nation, including rulers and citizens, and the transition of society to stability. The true requirement for the well-being of a society is provided by the existence of just laws and its indiscriminate application. The law defines the competencies of the state and the obligations of the people, and defines the rights and freedoms of citizenship, so that critics and political opponents of the system can civilly

express their criticism and opposition and defend their legitimate rights. In this way, the rule of law makes it possible for Afghanistan to move towards a real and lasting peace, which we are now much far from, and which is defined with the concepts of “security, justice and freedom”.

For more than seven months, officials of the *de facto* Taliban government, with a one-group, one-guild, and one-sex combination, in a discriminatory manner and violating civil rights, have entrusted the management of all matters to Islamic Sharia, and refer the rights and freedoms of the people to "Islamic and national values". This general and apparently "religious and national" argumentation is in fact aimed at delegating the authority to their officials to deal with the people according to their intentions and perceptions about these concepts, which in practice has caused a severe violation of the rights and freedoms of the people. We witness on daily basis the violation of human dignity, the imprisonment of women, journalists and civil activists, beatings, murders and even the ban on girls' education and prohibition of the national and traditional celebrations, the Nowruz, and the new year.

The rule of law and its implementation prevent anarchy, killings and arrests based on the order and *Fatwa* of this and that *Mufti*. The law protects moral dignity and the right to life of human beings. The rule of law is a key element in limiting the autocratic power, which gives meaning to the rights and freedoms of citizens and safeguards the high humane values and rights.

The words of the well-known and patriotic poet, Gul Pacha Ulfat in the interpretation of the rule of law, are noteworthy:

*‘If someone hits me with a branch, he is an oppressor,
but if the law cuts off my head, this is justice’.*

It is noteworthy that for fourteen centuries Islamic history, tolerance and moderation has been the guiding campus, and throughout this has been engrained and enshrined in the national values of the society and laws in Afghanistan and particularly since over a century of Afghan legislative experience and constitutionalism.

In the entire Islamic world, Afghanistan has the most Islamic and the best civil and penal codes. The civil law, which is based on the different faiths of the holy religion of Islam and adopted in (2416) articles, is one of the best civil laws in the Islamic world as acknowledgment of eminent Islamic jurists and religious authorities such as scholars in the renowned Al-Azhar University, Cairo Egypt. These laws define in detail the rights and freedoms of all people, both men and women. However, raising the question of Islamic and non-Islamic law in the Islamic society of Afghanistan is the work of the historical enemies of our country who cannot see, and hinder the passage of our homeland to the path of progress. In the last century, no law has been enacted in Afghanistan in contradiction to the principles of the holy religion of Islam. The constitutions of Afghanistan contain the provision which explicitly states that:

“No law shall contravene the tenets and provisions of the holy religion of Islam in Afghanistan.”

In the 21st century, constitution has been a connecting bridge of Afghanistan to the international community and the world's major economic and cultural organizations, and a manifestation of the law-abiding nature of the Afghan government and its commitment to the United Nations Charter and the international covenants to which it is a party. Unfortunately, during this period, the "international community", with all its “moral obligations” towards Afghanistan and its bloody tragedy, has never seriously emphasized the implementation of the constitution or the commitment of the *de facto* Taliban government to the UN Charter, and with continuation of its indigent policy speaks of the "inclusive government ", which evoke in our minds the concept of the same joint stock company and kleptocracy of the last decade.

A truly inclusive government in Afghanistan can only be achieved in the presence of the constitution and the precise separation of the three powers, so that in the presence of good governance, the best qualified and specialized persons, from different ethnic groups and regions, can participate in the state power and administration. The neighboring countries, the region, and major international and rival powers interact with Afghanistan because of their own interests, and these legal crises and lack of legitimacy in Afghanistan do not affect them. The main victims of the continuation of the disastrous situation are our oppressed people.

Thus:

To address the most fundamental and "key element" of the Afghan problem and with a view to attaining their legitimate rights and freedoms, the following issues are raised:

The *de facto* government of the Taliban and its council of ministers must officially declare:

- The continuation of the previous constitution with suspension of some of its chapters and articles, the previous laws, including the civil law and the penal code, and oblige all government institutions to comply with it. (If there are considerations about the previous continuation, they should reinstate the constitution of 1964 with amending some of its chapters and provisions.)

The implementation of the (provisional) constitution provides an opportunity for the people to agree to in a public debate on their preferred political regime and adoption of constitution.

The Taliban are now facing a major and crucial test:

- Abiding by the supreme interests of Afghanistan, national values, religion of the people and the implementation of the constitution and the rule of law, or

Clinging to the very petrified and ideological cortex, under the name of a spurious Sharia, with their own unique interpretation. It is important to understand that the main source of legitimacy is inside Afghanistan and is materialized with the establishment of the rule of law and the exercise of the right of national sovereignty by the people.

By submitting this call, the Afghan Lawyers Association in Europe, in understanding and joint efforts with esteemed institutions and personalities, call upon:

All champions of the rights and freedoms of the people, defenders of women's rights, civil and political entities, and protectors of the rule of law that, by grasping the highest interests of Afghanistan and in the interests of the oppressed people, and through a great historic civil uprising, choose the implementation of constitution and establishment of the rule of law, which are the basis for the realization of the right of national sovereignty and citizenship rights, as their common demand and a national and universal claim.

We urge the international community and the United Nations to consider this legitimate demand of us as a prerequisite for interaction and recognition of the Taliban *de facto* government and use their good offices for its materialization.
